





2 eggs, lightly beaten 2 tbs marmalade 1 cup self raising flour 1 cup plain flour 1/4 tsp salt 1/2 cup sherry

<u>Method:</u> Place the mixed fruit, sugar, spice, water and butter in a large saucepan and bring to the boil. Simmer gently for 3 minutes, then remove from stove, add bicarbonate of soda to the mixture and allow to cool.

Add the sherry, eggs and marmalade, mixing well. Fold in the sifted dry ingredients then place in a greased and lined 20 cm round cake tin. Bake in a moderately slow oven for 1½ hours, or until cooked when tested.

#### Class 38 - Rich Fruit Cake Recipe

#### Ingredients:

250g raisins - cut into 2-3 pieces 250g currants 250g sultanas 250g plain flour

125g chopped mixed peel % cup sherry or brandy 90g chopped blanched almonds % tsp grated nutmeg

60g self-raising flour ½ tsp cloves ½ tsp. ground ginger 4 large eggs 250g butter ½ tsp vanilla essence

250g soft brown sugar ½ tsp lemon essence or finely grated lemon rind ½ tsp almond essence 90g red glace cherries, cut into 4-6 pieces

#### Method:


Mix together all the fruit and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight. Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place the mixture in a prepared square tin no larger than 20cm (8") and bake in a slow oven for approx. 3 ½ - 4 hrs. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

Notes: 20cm (8") square tin only, no rounded corners.

To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2-3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crossways into 3-4 pieces.
